

HANDYAUDIT PUBLICATION SUMMARY

There are several projects, peer-reviewed publications, Quality Improvement Plans, and other publications relating to HandyAudit. This document is intended to give a summary about them.

Peer-Reviewed Publications and Programs

(a) Adoption Research to Improve Care (ARTIC) Program

In 2010 HandyAudit was vetted and chosen to be a demonstration of Adopting Research to Improve Care, a program intended to move research into practice and drive quality improvement. http://caho-hospitals.com/partnerships/adopting-research-to-improve-care-artic/

As part of this program, the HandyAudit technology went through a rigorous vetting process including a peer review process (following the CIHR merit review process) carried out by the ARTIC Program Selection Panel: a skills-based multidisciplinary task force including clinical practice and research leaders, knowledge translation experts and representatives from Health Quality Ontario and the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care. Only a small fraction of submissions are accepted as ARTIC projects.

I have attached a detailed Overview and Evaluation for the ARTIC projects as attachments. These reports were commissioned by the Council of Academic Hospitals of Ontario and authored by an arms' length consultancy group. I will ask that you treat these documents as confidential, but I'd like to highlight:

- 1) Phase I Evaluation The rigor of the evaluation and selection process.
- 2) Phase II Evaluation Impact of projects "has proven effective at implementing selected evidence-based interventions in multiple sites consistently, rapidly, and with high levels of fidelity and sustainment."
